Dear Shellingford School Family,

Welcome back to Spring Term Four. We hope that you and your family have managed to have a restful and enjoyable half-term break.

We have started off the term by celebrating World Day yesterday and as usual we were highly impressed with the array of costumes and book characters. We have spent the last four days focusing on books and a love of reading with different classroom activities running throughout the day for the children. One of the activities has been 'The Masked Reader'. We recorded members of staff reading a short section from a favourite book through a filter which added a different face and voice. The children then had to write down their guesses with the adults being 'unmasked' on Friday! Schools across the country have also once again been given £1.00 Book Tokens to distribute to children. # Reminders - we would also appreciate your help and support with the following:

#### **School Uniform**

We quite often receive comments from visitors on how smart the children look, and we would like to thank you for ensuring the children arrive at school looking clean, tidy and wearing the correct uniform! However, we have noticed recently that some items are being worn which are not part of our school Uniform Policy. Please can I remind you that friendship bracelets, wristbands, necklaces, boots or trainers are not to be worn at school and socks and hair accessories need to be either grey, black, blue or white in colour. Long hair also needs to be tied back.

# **Driving and Parking through the Village**

I have recently received reports from concerned parents and visitors to the school regarding the driving and parking of vehicles at the start of the school day. We all want our children to arrive safely at school. Parking is difficult so allow ample time to bring children into school for 8.45am and **please** watch your speed as your drive through the village.

Please can we remind you about the following issues involved with the amount of traffic in the village and ask you to work with us:

- Parking further along Church Street away from the school will help alleviate congestion by the Nursery and avoid potential accidents. Be aware of leaving sufficient access to residents' driveways and 'keep clear' markings near farm entrances.
- o Car-sharing with other families, even just once a week to help reduce the number of vehicles.
- On not park on the pavement as this restricts access for pedestrians and makes it very difficult to cross the road due to reduced vision up and down the street. This is particularly dangerous for the younger children walking to school who cannot be seen by drivers' due to the parked cars. Pedestrians please supervise your children carefully and be aware of moving vehicles.
- Do not use the green area in front of the school for dropping off, picking up or parking as this is the school's main access for emergency services. The safety of our children is paramount. Only designated taxis and mini-buses are permitted to use area. This is also a private road.

These initiatives will only work if we  $\underline{all}$  try to change our habits and consider the needs of others. Thank you.
