## IS MY CHILD TOO ILL FOR SCHOOL?

It is usually appropriate for parents and carers to send their children to school with mild respiratory illnesses. This would include general cold symptoms: a minor cough, runny nose or sore throat. However, children should not be sent to school if they have a temperature of 38°C or above. If your child is feverish, vomiting or has diarrhoea where they must remain at home for 48 hours **after** these symptoms have subsided to prevent risk of infection spreading to others. We would encourage you to read the NHS guidance 'is my child too ill for school' which has further information for parents.
